

## **eTwinning Project**

### **Cultural Interior Concept**

Project for students of Art and Interior Design aimed at making a presentation of an interior design concept for the partner group, based on the wishes and requirements arising out of culture.

#### **Schools involved in the project**

- HMC Vocational College for Woodworking, Furniture and Interior Design, Rotterdam, the Netherlands - Frauke van Leuken (Teacher of Interior Design and Citizenship);
- Liceo Artistico Statale "Umberto Preziosi - Osvaldo Licini" Fermo, Italy - Maria Tiziana Catinari (Teacher of English) with the support of Alberto Morici (Teacher of Interior Design)

#### **Members**

Two classes of 45 students altogether, from 16 to 19 years old.

- Class 1WB40 from HMC, Rotterdam;
- Class 3AAS from Liceo Artistico Preziosi, Fermo.

#### **Project Planning**

1. Introduction email (first week of March 2016): students introduce themselves to their e-pals.
2. Second email. Students tell about their schools and the study programme they follow.
3. Make a short video (3-5 min) in the class/school, with the whole group. Students tell each other about cultural habits (e.g. they show something - like typical food and drinks, fashion - and tell about Italian/Dutch feasts, music, art etc. Then they share the video on Twinspace.
4. Third email. Students tell about the kind of interior/design style they like and their wishes for their own living room and kitchen.
5. Fourth email with a Programme of Requirements based on the wishes of their pen friend >> "interior designer to client".
6. First Skype session.
7. Make a moodboard with a short description - as interior designers would do with their own clients. Use of Padlet.
8. Fifth email. Students give each other feedback on the moodboard.
9. Skype session to end the project and say goodbye.
